

- 2013 journal impact factor : 1.600




### **Received manuscripts by country**

Number of Manuscripts by Country






### **Decision Ratio (2013)**

- Publication ethics: ex) plagiarism
- Case reports
- Poor manuscript formatting

  - The authors take pride in their work
  - The authors respect the journal and reviewers

Clinical trials, systematic reviews and guidelines compare beneficial and nonbeneficial outcomes following interventions. Often, however, various studies on a particular topic do not address the same outcomes, making it difficult to draw clinically useful conclusions when a group of studies is looked at as a whole [1]. This problem was recently thrown into sharp focus by a systematic review of interventions for preterm birth prevention, which found that among 103 randomised trials, no fewer than 72 different outcomes were reported [2]. There is a growing recognition among clinical researchers that this variability undermines consistent synthesis of the evidence, and that what is needed is an agreed standardised collection of outcomes-a "core outcomes set"-for all trials in a specific clinical area [1]. Recognising that the current inconsistency is a serious hindrance to progress in our specialty, the editors of over 50 journals related to women's health have come

- Manuscript File (include in the following order):
  - Title Page (include all of the following information)
    - Title of the report
    - Author list of 7 or fewer names
      - Names of each author's institutions and an indication of each author's affiliation
    - Funding source



- Title Page (include all of the following information)
  - Name, address, telephone and fax numbers, and e-mail address of the corresponding author
  - Running head of fewer than 50 characters (including spaces)
  - Conflict of interest
  - List of where and when the study has been presented in part elsewhere, if applicable



- Abstract
  - Limit of 250 words
  - Formatted with the following headings:
    - Objective
    - Methods
    - Results
    - Conclusion



- Body text:
  - word count limits (STRICTLY ENFORCED)
    - Original Reports: 3,500 words
    - Review Articles: 4,500 words
    - Correspondence & Editorial: 1,500 words
  - Text headings
    - Introduction / Materials and Methods / Results / Discussion
- References
  - Sequentially, in the order that they are cited
- Figure legends



### **Instruction for authors**

- Also pay attention to
  - Reference style
  - Table footnotes styles
    - superscript symbols in sequence: \*, †, ‡, §, II, ¶, \*\*, ††, ‡‡
  - Don't put figure within body text
  - Separate figure legends



### **Advices for formatting**

### • Do

- Allow time for formatting
- Double check
- Use conventional and formal font (Times New Roman, Arial)
- Provide page number and line number
- Use double space and adequate font size (12pts)
- Left justify
- Don't
  - Don't guess / Don't assume
  - No fancy fonts. No underline.
  - Don't skip a line between paragraphs
